Dear Luther Memorial,

All things come of thee, O Lord; and of thine own have we given unto thee. Amen.

In my time in Philadelphia I cannot tell you how many times we sang this as an offertory verse. It is not found in our hymnals or worship resources, but we do have the hymn *We Give Thee but Thine Own* which bears a similar sentiment. It took until this year, as I was looking ahead to worship for Commitment Sunday on November 10, for me to look up the referent verses for these similar hymn-and several others in our worship materials. Lo and behold, this text comes from the book of Chronicles.

Now, Chronicles is not a book we read often in worship. Actually, I'm not sure we ever read from Chronicles. Originally meant more for the statisticians and scribes in the court, much of Chronicles is told in the books of Samuel and Kings in much more interesting ways. But from Chronicles we get the story of David the King who gifts all the supplies, adornments, fittings, and furnishings for the Temple that his son Solomon will build. As he is boastfully listing out (for 14 verses) everything that he has given for the Temple, he takes a moment to contemplate, "'But who am I, and what is my people, that we should be able to make this freewill offering? For all things come from you, and of your own have we given you. For we are aliens and transients before you, as were all our ancestors; our days on the earth are like a shadow, and there is no hope. O Lord our God, all this abundance that we have provided for building you a house for your holy name comes from your hand and is all your own.'"

Even amidst the lists and lists of riches, David takes a moment to recognize that everything is from God and that without God the people of God are and have nothing.

This time of year, November, our civil calendar invites us to turn and recognize the same about our blessings in this land of hope and promise. To look at everything we have and realize that it all comes from God and belongs to God. We even have the federal holiday of Thanksgiving to do just that. We give thanks for "all things come from you, O God."

In the Church, we continue the contemplate of David, "and of your own have we given you." In this season, amid our thankfulness, we also are called to consider the ways that we can give of what we have first received to support the mission of God in this place. We are not building a Temple from scratch, but there are very real and practical needs for us to support this place of ministry. There are, indeed, also theological and ecclesial considerations as well. But we should not shy away from the practical in deference to the spiritual.

I invite you, therefore, to take time in these first few weeks of November to contemplate how you have been blessed by God in the past year—your job, your retirement, your children and grandchildren, your education, your home. Give thanks for God's providence in your life. And consider how you can return to God even some of the blessings you have first received.

We will collect and offer up our commitments of financial support on Sunday, November 10 at both services. We will dedicate them to God and God's mission for them in this place. And then we will continue to give thanks for the ways God blesses us. See you in church!

We continue our feature of Social Statements of the ELCA leading up to Church Wide Assembly 2025. In order of approval and publication, this month is the Social Statement on The Death Penalty (1991).

A reminder that the summaries in our newsletter are presented on the ELCA church-wide website and were developed by the *Theological Discernment Department* in the Office of the Presiding Bishop.

In future editions we will explore other Social Statements in order of their approval and endorsement. So, you can look forward to: Peace (1995); Economic Life (1999); Health and Healthcare (2003); Education (2007); Human Sexuality (2009); Genetics (2011); The Church and Criminal Justice (2013); Sexism (2019).

Caring for Creation: Vision, Hope, Justice The ELCA Statement on environment Summary

Major Theme:

Human beings are called to care for the creation because we are full participants in the creation itself. The way we are to participate should imitate the way God cares for the creation--as a servant king. Rooted in the vision of God's care for creation while troubled by signs of sin and yet empowered by the hope of creation's fulfillment, the statement calls people of faith to carry out a calling to care for creation guided by principles of justice. This involves:

- honoring the integrity of creation
- striving for fairness within the human community

The title Caring for Creation: Vision, Hope and Justice summarizes the statement:

- Caring implies keeping, loving the creation, living wisely
- Creation here designates all that exists but with particular attention to the earth and entire, complex and interdependent ecology.
- Vision refers to the biblical vision of a flourishing creation
- Hope refers to the confidence people of faith have that God will bring the whole creation to fulfillment, as God has promised
- Justice suggests the principles by which people of faith should be guided in their actions today toward the environment.

Statement is based in our witness to God as shared in ecumenical creeds and scripture:

- God the creator blesses the world, sees it as 'very good,' continues to bless it and to be involved in it;
- God the Son—the Word made flesh through whom all things were made reconciles the world to God through the Cross. Christ comes to us in water, bread and wine and frees us from sin and empowers us to serve all creation. We do this both by modeling God's care for creation, and by heralding the new creation;
- God the Holy Spirit—'the Lord, the giver of life' (Nicene creed) is the source of life and renews the face of the earth, sustains us in the promise of a redemption that includes all creation;
- Response of faith—a basic trust and hope in God, and a basic trust in the fundamental sufficiency of creation for all its creatures that is expressed in living out the responsibility we have been granted to care for creation.

The most fundamental threats to creation result primarily from human activity and injustices:

- Excessive consumption by the relatively well-off
- High population growth and the pressure it puts on creation. Contributing conditions to excessive population growth include such things as lack of access to family planning and health care, good education, lack of employment at adequate wages, and unequal rights.

Caring for Creation: Vision, Hope & Justice – a summary

- We model God's justice by striving to embody 4 four principles in the face of the intricate complexity of creation and of the human community:
- Participation—All human beings are entitled to a voice and to have their interests considered when decisions are made affecting the creation and its resources. Human beings should be advocates for the non-human parts of creation;
- Solidarity We acknowledge our interdependence with other creatures, and act both locally and globally on behalf of all creation, especially those parts that are most vulnerable and at greatest risk;
- Sufficiency—We are to place priority on meeting the basic needs of all humanity and all creatures and since the earth's resources are finite, this has implications for human acquisition and consumption patterns;
- Sustainability—We should act so as to provide "an acceptable quality of life for present generations without compromising that of future generations."

Task for the Church:

- Creation-awareness and education;
- Imitate God's care for creation in our life and activity as a church;
- Be a community of moral deliberation, and a venue for civic deliberation about caring for creation;
- Provide for and foster public policy advocacy;
- Foster and support corporate social responsibility.



October 2024 Council Meeting



- 1. *Minutes* On motion, the September 10, 2024 Council meeting minutes were unanimously approved following a correction to the "Communications" section.
