


THE COMMUNION

Worship Matters!

The First Sunday of Ordinary Time is <u>always</u> the celebration of Jesus' baptism. There are really two periods in the Church Year when we observe "ordinary time." You can tell these seasons because the color for the season is green—a color of growth and life. These seasons (one after the Epiphany until just before Lent and the other after the Day of Pentecost until the end of the Church Year) are called "ordinary" not because they are ho-hum or unnecessary but because we mark these times with ordinal numbers (First, Second, Third, etc.). We are marking time nevertheless but, in these seasons, we learn and celebrate more about *our* part in the story rather than specific events in the life of Jesus. The more colorful seasons of the Church Year are broken up into two cycles: The Incarnation Cycle, which we just completed on The Epiphany, marks a time of preparation for (Advent) and then celebration of (Christmas) God Incarnate: Jesus is born! The Resurrection Cycle, which comes at the end of this first ordinary time, marks a time of preparation for (Lent) and celebration of (Easter) the Resurrected Christ. Both of these cycles end with a celebration wherein we take our place in the story: on The Epiphany we are drawn into the story of proclaiming God in the World by seeing ourselves in the magi from afar; on The Day of Pentecost, we are drawn into the story of proclaiming the defeat of death and sin by celebrating the birth of the Church and the gift of the Holy Spirit upon all believers.

So, in this Ordinary Time, let us not cease our celebrations but rather recognize our place in the story of God-atwork-in-the-world and continue our proclamation. As the theologian Howard Thurman wrote:

When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and princes are home, when the shepherds are back with their flock, the work of Christmas begins: To find the lost,

To find the lost, To heal the broken, To feed the hungry, To release the prisoner, To rebuild the nations, To bring peace among others, To make music in the heart.

January 13 – Psalm 106:1-12; Judges 4:1-16; Ephesians 6:10-17

January 14 – Psalm 106:1-12; Judges 5:12-21; I John 5:13-21

January 15 - Martin Luther King Jr., renewer of society, martyr, 1968 - Exodus 3:7-12; Psalm 77:11-20; Romans 12:9-21; Luke 6:27-36 -- An American prophet of justice among races and nations, King was an eloquent preacher, a leader of the nonviolent resistance to race-segregated society, and recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964. Born on this date, he was assassinated on April 4, 1968.

January 16 – Psalm 36:5-10; Jeremiah 3:1-5; Acts 8:18-24

January 17 – Anthony of Egypt, renewer of the church, c. 356; Pachomius, renewer of the church, 346 – I Peter 5:6-10; Psalm 91:9-16; Mark 10:17-21 -- One of the earliest of the Egyptian desert fathers, Antony gave away his sizeable inheritance and became a hermit. Later he became leader of a group of monks who devoted themselves to prayer, worship, and labor. AND Born in Egypt, Pachomius became a Christian while a soldier. He became a hermit (a solitary monk) and organized others into a religious community. His rule for monasteries influenced later ones in both the Eastern and Western churches.

January 18 – THE CONFESSION OF PETER, The Beginning of The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity – Acts 4:8-13; Psalm 18:1-6, 16-19; I Corinthians 10:1-5; Matthew 16:13-19 -- Today the church remembers the apostle Peter's great acknowledgement of Jesus as "the Christ, the Son of the living God." This festival serves as a fitting beginning to the week in which we particularly pray that all Christians might be united in faith and witness.
