MESSAGE FOR THE YOUNG AND YOUNG-AT-HEART

¹Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you. ²For darkness shall cover the earth and thick darkness the peoples, but the Lord will arise upon you, and the glory of the Lord will appear over you. ³Nations shall come to your light and rulers to the brightness of your dawn. ⁴Lift up your eyes and look around; they all gather together; they come to you; your sons shall come from far away, and your daughters shall be carried in their nurses' arms. ⁵Then you shall see and be radiant; your heart shall thrill and rejoice, because the abundance of the sea shall be brought to you; the wealth of the nations shall come to you. ⁶A multitude of camels shall cover you, the young camels of Midian and Ephah; all those from Sheba shall come. They shall bring gold and frankincense and shall proclaim the praise of the Lord.

SECOND READING: Ephesians 3:1-2

¹ This is the reason that I, Paul, am a prisoner for Christ Jesus for the sake of you gentiles, ²for surely you have already heard of the commission of God's grace that was given me for you ³and how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I wrote above in a few words, ⁴a reading of which will enable you to perceive my understanding of the mystery of Christ. ⁵In former generations this mystery was not made known to humankind, as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: ⁶that is, the gentiles have become heirs with us, members of the same body, and sharers in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel. ⁷Of this gospel I have become a servant according to the gift of God's grace that was given me by the working of God's power. ⁸Although I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given to me to bring to the gentiles the news of the boundless riches of Christ ⁹and to make everyone see what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God, who created all things, ¹⁰so that through the church the wisdom of God in its rich variety might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. ¹¹This was in accordance with the

eternal purpose that God has carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord, ¹²through faith in whom we have access to God in boldness and confidence.

^{2:1}In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, magi from the east came to Jerusalem, ²asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star in the east and have come to pay him homage." ³When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him, ⁴and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. ⁵They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it has been written by the prophet:

⁶ And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,

are by no means least among the rulers of Judah.

for from you shall come a ruler

who is to shepherd my people Israel."

⁷Then Herod secretly called for the magi and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. ⁸Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child, and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." When they had heard the king, they set out, and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen in the east, until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. ¹¹On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. ¹²And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road. ¹³Now after they had left, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you, for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him." ¹⁴Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother by night, and went to Egypt ¹⁵ and remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet, "Out of Egypt I have called my son." ¹⁶When Herod saw that he had been tricked by the magi, he was infuriated, and he sent and killed all the children in and around Bethlehem who were two years old or under, according to the time that he had learned from the magi. ¹⁷Then what had been spoken through the prophet Jeremiah was fulfilled:

¹⁸"A voice was heard in Ramah,

wailing and loud lamentation,

Rachel weeping for her children;

she refused to be consoled, because they are no more."

¹⁹When Herod died, an angel of the Lord suddenly appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, ²⁰"Get up, take the child and his mother, and go to the land of Israel, for those who were seeking the child's life are dead." ²¹Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel. ²²But when he heard that Archelaus was ruling Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. And after being warned in a dream, he went away to the district of Galilee. ²³There he made his home in a town called Nazareth, so that what had been spoken through the prophets might be fulfilled, "He will be called a Nazarene."



THE PROCLAMATION OF THE MOVEABLE FEASTS

P Know, dear siblings, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior:

On the fifth day of March will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the great fast of Lent.

On the seventeenth day of April we will gather around this Table for the celebration of Maundy Thursday and our annual commemoration of the institution of Our Lord's Supper and his command to love one another with servant-like love.

On the eighteenth day of April will fall Good Friday, and the contemplation of our Lord's merciful Passion.

On the nineteenth day of April, we will gather for the Great Vigil of Easter and the recitation of our Salvation History.

On the twentieth day of April we will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the commencement of the Week of Sundays, the Great Feast of Eastertide.

On the twenty-ninth day of May will fall the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the eighth day of June, the Great feast of Pentecost, and the celebration of the birth of the Church catholic.

On the fifteenth day of May, the Feast of the Holy Trinity, and the contemplation of the great mystery of the Godhead.

The twenty-third day of November will see the conclusion of this liturgical year as we celebrate the feast of Christ Jesus, Sovereign of the Universe.

And on the thirtieth day of November, we will begin the Church year again with the celebration of the First Sunday of Advent.

To Jesus Christ who was and is and is to come the ruler of time be all honor and glory forever.







Receive the bread in your open palm, then hold your cup steady for the assisting minister to fill.


As you return by the side aisles, please place your empty cup in the tray.



Worship Matters!

Twelfth Night is tonight! While it can be debated whether tomorrow, The Epiphany of Our Lord, is the end of the 12 Days of Christmas or the beginning of the next seasons, what we realize is that this celebration opens the good news of God in the World through Jesus to all people. By the revelation of a star, the Great Morning Star is known to all the world and not just to some shepherds in Bethlehem. The season which follows—the Season after the Epiphany—begins and ends with two feasts that again reveal Jesus as the beloved Child of God. In this season, we take inspiration from all those who encounter Jesus—whether the Christ Child in the manger, the boy on his mother's lap in Bethlehem, the boy-child in the Temple, or the man on a mission who is baptized by his cousin before his ministry begins—and go forth from our encounter with Jesus here to proclaim the good news in the world.

The Epiphany, celebrated on January 6 each year is the last of the Major Feasts of the Church with an immovable date. All the rest of the feasts and fasts of the year take their dates from the "Golden Date" of Easter (the first Sunday after the first full moon after the vernal equinox) which moves every year. As such, it has been a tradition in the church—and one we share this morning—to announce the moveable feasts for the rest of the Church Year just after the Gospel reading.

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

January 6 – **THE EPIPHANY OF OUR LORD** – Isaiah 60:1-16; Psalm 72:1-7, 10-14; Ephesians 3:1-12; Matthew 2:1-12 - The feast of Epiphany ("manifestation") concludes the Christmas season with a celebration of God's glory revealed in the person of Jesus Christ.
