Readings and Commemorations This Week

May 13 – Psalm 115; Exodus 28:29-38; Philippians 1:3-11

May 14 – Matthias, Apostle – Isaiah 66:1-2; Psalm 56; Acts 1:15-26; Luke 6:12-18 -- Matthias was the apostle added to the Twelve after Jesus' resurrection, as a replacement for the dead Judas Iscariot. He had traveled among the followers of Jesus throughout the Lord's ministry. Formerly commemorated on February 24, Matthias's celebration is moved to May 14 in agreement with most Western calendars.

May 15 - Psalm 115; Ezra 9:5-15; John 16:16-24

May 16 – Psalm 33:12-22; Genesis 2:4b-7; I Corinthians 15:42b-49

May 17 – Psalm 33:12-22; Job 37:1-13; I Corinthians 15:50-57

May 18 – Erik, King of Sweden, martyr, 1160 – Micah 6:6-8; Psalm 9:1-10; I Corinthians 1:26-31; Mark 8:34-38 – Erik is considered the patron saint of Sweden. As king of that nation, he tried to bring peace in the region, and to spread Christianity in Scandinavia. He was also known for his attempts to make fair laws and to protect those who were poor or sick.
